### Balanced scoring rallied Coastside.net to 7-5 win over HMB Lions Club

Coastside.net rallied to defeat HMB Lions Club 7-5 in a Bantam game with balanced scoring from both teams, as 9 players recorded points.

**Scott Brovarney** opened the scoring on a low shot past a diving goalie at the 5:24 mark, as he converted a pass from **Sam Vaughn**. Just :25 later **Kion Mahrouzadeh** tied it on a wrist shot off a feed from **Connor Goodin**. HMB Lions Club retook the lead on a nifty passing play that developed from a Brovarney pass to Vaughn, and **CJ Huntsinger** sent it past the sprawling goalie.

Just :24 before halftime, Goodin rebounded his own shot to make it 3-2 at the break. After a rousing pep talk at halftime, Goodin scored on a spinning backhand 2:02 into the third period. Mahrouzadeh broke the tie and gave Coastside.net its first lead with 2:21 left in the third on a long hard wrist shot through the 5-hole from the left face-off circle. **Patrick Weston** pounced on a puck perched on the goal line, set up by Goodin, for the team's fourth unanswered goal.

Coach Bret Berner's ensuing brief between-periods speech inspired Huntsinger to take the opening faceoff and skate past the defenders, as he deked the goalie and put a low wrister from the right corner to cut it to 5-4.

Brovarney hit the post in his frantic attempt to tie the game, but **Nik Gutierrez** made it 6-4 when he scored on a wrist shot that went top cheese (as they say in Canada, for top shelf).

Coastside.net defensive tandem of **Holden Hix** and **Devin Menzies** were a wall of voodoo in front of goalie **Brody Menzies**, and repeatedly denied forward **Jeffrey Berner**. **Cody Hassler** and **James McKusick** both missed after they worked themselves free behind the defense, but the strong defense of Coastside.net held. On the other end, **Jake Spaeth** made 17 saves in the contest.

Weston scored on a low backhand on a pass from Gutierrez with :19.8 left, but **Wesley Walters** scored his first goal of the season just before the final buzzer to close out the scoring, with the final result 7-5 in favor of the undefeated Coastside.net team.
