DoubleShot Contest Results


Highlights of our **DoubleShot Halftime Contest**:

Each week, we feature the people behind the league, the supporters who make it work. This week's sponsor:

Dr. Kenneth L. Stasun, DDS

Dr. Stasun is a specialist in orthodontics. He has practiced on the coast since 1974 and practices exclusively in Half Moon Bay. Dr. Stasun uses conventional orthodontic appliances as well as appliances that allow the patient's own musculature to direct growth direction and tooth movement.

He attended dental school at C.W.R.U. After his internship, he spent two years with the U.S.P.H.S. in charge of Indian dental clinics, one on the rim, and the other at the bottom of the Grand Canyon. Dr. Stasun left the service as a Lt. Commander and attended U.C.S.F. for his orthodontic residency.

With the exception of cross bites or large skeletal problems, Dr. Stasun is a firm believer in timing the start of orthodontic care to the pubertal growth spurt. This usually allows for a one-phase treatment approach (treating the patient once) in most cases.

He emphasizes that the proper time to start is not when all the baby teeth have been lost, rather when the first bicuspid are erupting. This signals a growth spurt and varies between 8 and 12 years of age.

Dr. Stasun's staff is composed of several coastsiders. They include Jill Impink, Lani Jones, and Inger Ball. His wife, Kathleen, retired from teaching and can be seen helping in his office. One of her favorite volunteer tasks is helping with the adoption of foreign babies. Dr. Stasun's 20-year old son, Kevin, attends college at Santa Clara University. Katelin, Dr. Stasun's daughter, graduated from Sonoma State and is in a paralegal program.

Josh Morrell's goal in the fourth round sealed the overtime shootout win for Cullyvore Construction. The exciting game featured a pair of goals from **Will Dexter** and **Austin Elchinoff**, and 4 goals from **Evan Farbstein** in his return from the DL.

Dexter scored his first goal 1:09 into the game off an Elchinoff feed, but **Cody Hassler** dished one to Farbstein, who ripped the mesh with a high backhand to tie it :37 later. Cullyvore Construction had the edge the rest of the first half, as Elchinoff scored two more unassisted goals in the opening period, and defender **Jack Fritz** helped goalie **Chris Bradley** stymie the scoring rushes of Lions Club forwards **Kyle Owens** and **Wesley Walters**.

Dexter made it 4-1 after converting a pass from guest player **Joe Erdie**, but Farbstein stole the puck and slid it through the 5-hole to cut it to 4-2 with 10 minutes to play.

Lions Club defenders **James McKusick** and **Jeffrey Berner** worked hard in front of goalie **Jake Spaeth**, who made 23 saves on the day. Then Farbstein rallied the Lions Club with 2 goals in the final 2:44 of regulation to send the game into overtime. He first slammed home his own rebound, then lit the red light with a clapper high to the glove side (that's a high slapshot, to our American readers) of a **Casey Schwenk** pass to tie the game.

But it was not enough, as after a scoreless 5-minute OT, Will Dexter scored in the second round, and Morrell provided the heroics for Cullyvore Construction. With brother **Cody Dexter** on deck for the overtime shootout, Morrell's goal, and Bradley's stop, ended the contest 2-0 after four rounds of the shootout.
