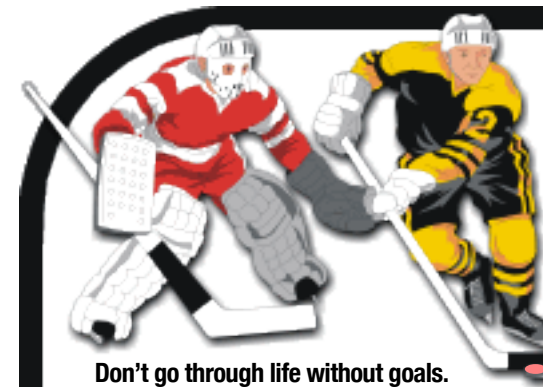

Pastorino Hay defeated HMB Review 3-2

Charlie Miller's third period goal proved to be the game winner as Pastorino Hay defeated HMB Review 3-2 in a battle for division leadership.

Michael Whitlach lit the red light first on a low forehand 2:50 into the game. Just :13.4 before the first period ended, **Dimitri Weinstein** tied the game from an impossible angle at the left corner. **Peyton Pastorino** went in with **Coel Miller** on a 2-on-1 and Miller found the back of the net to regain the lead at the 6:03 mark of the second period.

Weinstein re-tied the game with a steal and a high wrist shot to the glove side.

Billy Ginna played shutdown goalie in the third period, with help from **Dominic Padua, Luca Padua** and **Patrick Ginna.**

Joel Glasman skated smoothly in the corners, with **Gloria Oseguera** breaking up several rushes mid-rink for HMB Review.

In the third, Miller's high backhand off a pass from Coel Miller decided the game, and Pastorino Hay had its 5th win of the season.

Jessica Oseguera was strong in goal again for HMB Review, with help from defenders **Sophie Green, Sam Louderback** and **Griffen Dulay.**

Graham Wylie had a hat trick and three players scored twice each as Palladino Painting defeated Kulda Construction 10-2.

Ethan Menzies was the first on the board with a low backhand off a pass from **Marek Palladino** halfway through the first period, and Wylie added the period's only other goal on a low wrister as **Taiten Hopkins** and **Joey De Meo** cleared the puck effectively.

A flurry of activity saw Palladino Painting extend its lead in the second frame. **Amanda Weston** scored just 1:14 into the period through the 5-hole on a rebound of a Palladino shot. Two minutes later Menzies scored on a low wrister past the stick side, and Palladino extended the lead to 5-0 on a tip-in of a long shot by **Maia Haley.**

In the third period, **Antono Roman** got behind the defense to score his 5th of the season, and then he fed Wylie for a low wrister to the glove side to make it 7-0.

North Cossman got on the board on a breakaway and a nice snapshot, then cut it to 7-2 as he broke away again to light the red light just :27 later for his ninth goal of the season.

Weston scored her second of the day as she tipped in a slapshot of a Palladino shot, and Palladino slapped home his own with 1:52 left in the game. With just :27.3 remaining, Roman fed Wylie for his third goal, as he deposited a wrister low to the glove side.

Forwards **Sasha Kulda, Grayson Capers** and **Cameron DeVry** skated well mid-rink but were stopped on defense by **Anthony Sassi** for Palladino Painting's fifth win on the season, to remain tied atop the Squirt division.



With help from **Joey De Meo (#1)** and **Taiten Hopkins (#3)**, **North Cossman (#10)** got behind the defense twice and converted both times for Kulda Construction.

Andy Olson, Grant Miller and Hunter Murison had hat tricks to lead Dr. Moody to a lopsided win over Dr. Alborzi.

Murison scored first on a low wrist shot off a pass from **Joe Gutierrez**, and then Gutierrez scored on a low backhand off a pass from **Austin Miller**. Olson scored the last goal of the first period when he went in on a 2-on-1 with Grant Miller.

Dr. Moody extended its lead to 4-0 when Grant Miller assisted on an Olson goal. With :23 left, Grant Miller scored on a low shot off a pass from Gutierrez, but at the :09.3 mark **Jacob Winstead** took a **Patrick Jones** pass and went in alone to score a nice forehand goal.

Though **Adam Mansell** saved 14 second-half shots with help from defenders **Sam King** and **Matthew Williams**, Dr. Moody was not to be denied. In the third an Olson shot was rebounded in by Grant Miller, who then went in alone on a breakaway, deked, and slid in a forehand. Before the period was over Olson would record his hat trick off a feathered pass from Grant Miller, and Murison would add another on a steal, then a high wrist shot to the glove side.

Goalie **Carson Murison** continued his strong play, stymieing high-scoring forward **Krister Lansing**. Gutierrez and Grant Miller worked the puck to Hunter Murison, who put in a low wrist. With :27.5 remaining, Austin Miller put an exclamation mark on the scoring with a high wrist shot to move Dr. Moody to 5-2 on the season.
