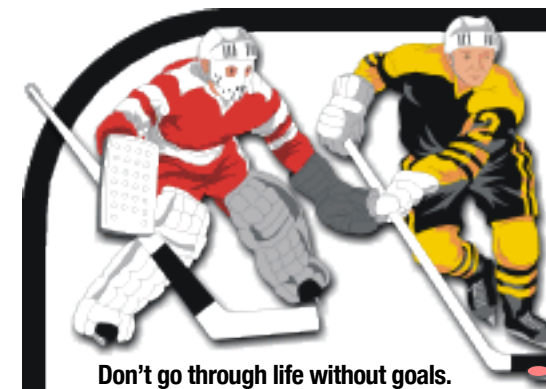

## Squirt Division

### S4 Pastorino Hay rallied to defeat S2 Kulda Construction 6-5 in OT Shootout

Chase Hebb scored for Pastorino Hay in the 6th round of the overtime shootout for a thrilling come-from-behind victory over Kulda Construction. Dominic Padua had a hat trick for the victors, while North Cossman scored 5 times, including the tying goal with :04 remaining in regulation.

Padua opened the scoring 1:49 into the game on a low slapshot off a feed from Peyton Pastorino. Cossman tied the game 2 minutes later on a low wrister to the stick side for the only goal against netminder Billy Ginna, but Pastorino Hay would score twice more before the end of the first period. Padua buried a Charlie Miller pass and then scored his third as he induced the goalie to sweep in his rebound.

Kulda Construction roared back in the second period. Defender Cameron DeVry cleared the puck to Cossman, who went the length of the blue ice to score. Cossman then skated around the defense for his third goal to tie the game at the end of the middle frame.

Cossman gave Kulda Construction its first lead as he rebounded his own wrister with 5:28 to play. With time ticking down, Pastorino Hay tied the game at 4-4 when Billy Ginna passed to Pastorino, who split the goaltender's pads.

With 1:53 left in regulation, Miller was good with the wood as he came from behind the net and put Pastorino Hay ahead on a high wrist shot. Forward Coel Miller was stymied by defender Patrick Ginna to keep Pastorino Hay ahead.

As the clock ticked down, Cossman took a desperation pass from Joey De Meo and skated through the heart of the defense and scored the game-tying goal with just :04 left.

Tanner Islander made 15 saves in regulation and 3 in OT, as both teams played passionately to try to poke in the puck.

A scoreless regulation saw Michael Whitlach and Luca Padua turn back the attack of Sasha Kulda and Taiten Hopkins and after 5 more scoreless minutes the teams went into the OT shootout.

Cossman opened the tense shootout by clanging one off the post. Charlie Miller then scored to make it 1-0, and after Hopkins also hit the post for Kulda Construction, Grayson Capers evened it on a low shot to the glove side. The goaltender's best friend ended Whitlach's attempt to take the lead. In the sixth round, after saves by both goalies, Hebb slapped one home to send home team Pastorino Hay home with the winner.

Four different players scored goals as Dr. Stasun held off a Dr. Alborzi rally in a see-saw 7-6 win. **Pace Farbstein** scored a hat trick for the victors while **Krister Lansing** tallied three times in defeat.

Farbstein scored on his first shot of the game as he took a cross-rink pass from **Ethan Glasman** and slapped home the rolling puck. Lansing tied it when he evaded the defense and skated in from the red line with :6.6 left in the first period.

The teams skated evenly in the second, with **Kevin Welch** took a saucered pass from Farbstein and backhanded it in through the 5-hole 3:49 into the period. Just :13 later, Lansing re-tied it on a high wrister. Dr. Alborzi took the lead when **Dante DiNapoli** put one past the low stick side of a nice feed from **Matthew Williams**. With time running down, Rasmus Green got behind the defense and put in a low forehand with :21.8 remaining in the half to send the teams to the locker room tied 3-3.
